


# Spring Hill Public School

#### K,1,2- Miss Cornish

This week students in Kindergarten and Year I will be creating a Solar System using polystyrene balls, paint and glitter, this is a part of our Science Unit of Space. We are also working on next year's books covers with some amazing and intricate colouring in. In maths we are concentrating on division, volume and capacity with students doing amazing job on their board books.

#### 2,3- Miss Nagle

This week we are learning about the importance of NAIDOC week and what it means to the Indigenous community as part of our history unit on celebrations. We are also continuing with our amazing narrative writing with students concentrating on planning and editing their own work while in numeracy students have been working to develop their division skills.

#### 4,5,6- Mrs Mac & Miss Wilson

This week in Y5/6 History we have been exploring What it means to be Australian and researching Australian icons and organisations. In Math, students in Primary have been building models using cubes and recording their models on isometric paper. In English students are continuing their work on exposition writing and enjoying creating a persuasive text about which is better, country or city life. The Primary students are also learning to edit and mark their own work using a persuasive writing checklist.
