- An unstable wobble surface for a child to sit in in a chair or even on the floor to help children with focus and memory retention, at home or in class.
- For the younger years that have a snooze time in the day, they can be used for pillows
- Even gentle traction for the mid back to open up the chest after hours of sitting.
- It can make the floor or chair more comfortable for story time.
- And lastly for the older kids, it can be used for exercises such as abdominal and balance exercises when the classes stop for exercise breaks.
